



Art & Science Archilab - When architecture breathes

Opened for Heritage Days, the new Frac Centre region currently hosts the 9 th Polymorph edition ArchiLab, real laboratory with the most advanced architectural design research. Founded in 1999 by Marie-Ange Brayer, director of FRAC Centre, and Frédéric Migayrou, Deputy Director at the Centre Pompidou, the event presents projects forty architects, designers and artists, chosen to echo the theme: "Naturaliser architecture ".

Everything starts at the Gare d'Austerlitz, a corridor leading to the wharf. To the left, a beautiful canvas print catches the eye and deflower the surprise: it is enshrined in an urban landscape outrageously blue and cloudy sky at once. The look does not linger too, needless to wane a representation while the building of glass and metal is just one and a half hour rail. Orleans is our destination. Jakob + MacFarlane designed by the building entrance FRAC Centre, named The turbulence is installed on an esplanade below the street and grafted on old army barracks. Three growths of metal and glass evoke a straight out of a science fiction novel hybrid body. Conceived as a place of interaction with the city and its inhabitants, it has several hundred diodes, true "light skin" designed by the artist duo Electronic Shadow (Naziha Mestaoui and Yacine Ait Kaci). Taking the construction lines of Turbulence, the spots become denser to materialize in turn lines, surfaces, volumes, images. Interactive, product responds to its environment, taking into account climate data and the requests of these creators pop animation scenarios designed by them. Once inside, the surprise was complete. The armor outside turns into a beautiful designed by a tubular metal structure carrying wood panels volume. A welcoming, warm and natural smile is like the place. But already the building is cleared, this eye, definitely always on the lookout, spotted Polymorph Jenny Sabin.

Manufactured using a 3D printer, ceramic modules 1300 overlap each other to compose in a selected volume by son stretched to several meters above the ground. The U.S. is interested in architecture's relationship with mathematics and science, especially biology. The project presented analyzes the shift between digital design and materialization. It shows a network of connections directly inspired by the cellular behavior. "Collaborating with scientists is rare. Should be brought together architects, designers, biologists, engineers ... in the same workshop to develop new ways of thinking, watching.rTime.text, Frac Centre or even abolish the borders between disciplines.
